

She blogs and shares free tutorials at www.sandraclemons.blogspot.com. She resides in Colorado with her daughter and husband.

Her lecture covers Sandra's background, quilting style, and how to make traditionally modern quilts while showing her quilts from Scrap Patchwork.

In 2004 Ann fell in love with the art of Landscape Quilting. Ann's inspiration and designs come from nature and the beautiful lakes and woods of Northwest and Upper Peninsula of Michigan. Ann works from photographs and has developed three distinctive quilting techniques

# Landscape Art Quilts by Ann Loveless www.quiltsbyann.com

Ann is a Northern Michigan quilt artist that captures the beauty of Northern Michigan in her art quilts. Ann has a clothing and textile degree with an emphasis in art from Michigan State University. She has had a love of sewing and fabric all her life and since 2005 has found her calling in art quilts which utilizes her sewing and art talent.

The subject matter in her quilts includes birch trees, flowers, ferns, sunsets, sparkling water, and snow and many other favorite nature scenes. Her good use of color gives her designs a punch along with using batik fabrics, yarns, tulle, angelina fiber and thread for texture and depth. Ann's work has a common theme of nature but she has developed different techniques that keep her work fresh and exciting. Her techniques include Fabric Mosaic" (fusible applique), "impressionistic" (layered fabrics under black tulle) and Collage (fusible web appliqué with free-motion machine stitching)

Two of Ann's quilts were accepted in the American Quilters Society, Paducah, KY; 2007 "Ski Village" and in 2009, "Trillium". "Birches" quilt was shown at the Albuquerque Fiber Festival in New Mexico, won a 3rd place award at the Art Works Alliance juried show in Traverse City and it also was accepted into the 2008 Michigan Governor's Artist Residency Program and hung in Jennifer Granholm home in East Lansing. Ann has also had 5 commission pieces that are hanging at Munson Hospital in Traverse City and 1 commission piece for Crystal Mountain's spa building in Thompsonville. MI. Ann also has several commission pieces at Paul Oliver Hospital Acute Care Facility in Frankfort, Michigan. Ann displayed at the Gerald Ford Presidential Museum in Grand Rapids for ArtPrize competition in 2011 with "Trillium" and 2012 with "Seasons" with a top 25 award. Ann was the featured artist at the Leland Fiber Festival in 2011. In 2012 Ann won "Peoples Choice" award for her quilt "Autumn" in Fiber 577 exhibit in Perrysburg, OH. Ann also won "People's Choice" award at the ArtRapids art fair in Elk Rapids, MI. Ann exhibited her "Poppies" quilt at the AQS Grand Rapids Quilt Show in August 2013 in Grand Rapids, MI. Ann won first place in the ArtPrize 2013 competition with her four paneled quilt "Sleeping Bear Dune Lakeshore". In 2015 Ann's book was published titled "Landscape Art Quilts". Ann and husband Steve won 2015 Artprize people choice award with "Northwood Awakening". Ann won honorable mention award at AQS Grand Rapids with "Sunset".

#### THEIR STORY

Jill & her sister Vicki grew up in the great little town of Pearl City. For many years they traveled to the post office to pick up the mail in the building that was once the bank. Who knew this building would house the greatest quilt/gift shop in North Western Illinois owned by the sisters! Opening in 1992 under the name Sew many Antiques they carried a nice supply of quality quilting fabrics, patterns, books and antiques of all kinds. Soon they outgrew the space and added to this historic building. The name was changed to Yellow Creek Quilt Designs in 2010. Although quilting supplies continued with great enthusiasm, the antiques faded away to make room for many wonderful gifts and a great selection of wool & Valdani threads. Yellow Creek Quilt Designs was a featured shop in Better Homes & Gardens Quilt Sampler magazine in 2011. Jill's patterns have been featured in several Primitive Quilts & Projects magazines. Their first book was published by Kansas City Star and is called Kindred Spirits. Jill's first fabric line Kindred Spirits for Windham Fabrics shipped Aug. 2015. Her third line, Kindred Spirits--Sisters will ship Aug. 2017. Jill & Vicki offer a club called Kindred Spirits featuring their exclusive pattern designs. Jill is now the shop owner and gets a great deal of help from Vicki and others. www.yellowcreekquiltdesigns.com
